3. Minutes of 10th May 2016

Approval of the minutes was proposed by Margaret Ingle and seconded by Fiona McEwan

4. Matters arising

- **4.1 David Motherwell:** it was made clear that this was not just being done to honour David but to acknowledge all the volunteers. It has been suggested we think about planting a tree but this would be towards the end of the year therefore this item to be put on the agenda for a future meeting.
- **4.2 Queens Birthday celebration:** as decided at the last meeting, the money was donated to the Day Centre who is going to do something to commemorate this event.

5. Treasurers Report

- **5.1 Festival report:** John handed out a detailed sheet for the Festival, which showed a profit this year of £2118. Jan said we need to build up the Festival fund and suggested the £2000 should stay in this account as a buffer. We have a reasonable sum in the LP fund but need to think about what we do with this money (have until March 2017 to decide so long as it is committed, we will not lose the money). This item is to be put on the agenda for the first meeting back in September. Some suggestions to be thinking about include a trolley for the Corn Exchange as well as some more cups (Town House). There's also the matter of the sound system for the Corn Exchange this would probably also require a grant. John said he had an idea for next years' Armistice details to follow.
- **5.2 Ideal Garage:** a request had come to the CC for help with doing up the Ideal Garage site. It was decided, by majority vote, that as we have already given £2000 to Blooming Haddington, that we cannot give any more at this time.

6. Councillors Corner

- **6.1 Whittinghame Drive raised table:** John asked if this could be painted so it stands out and to help prevent cars parking close to the area at the skatepark. There is a greater risk to children running out when cars are parked so close obscured site-lines etc. Tom Trotter suggested that the area is under review and a crossing is being considered. Chris pointed out that even though an off-road car park has been created this hasn't reduced the number of cars parking on the road. It was reported though that there seems to be a reduction in problems in the town centre since the skatepark opened.
- **6.2 Reporting of problems on the roads:** Chris said he has been following reports he made on-line and so far has only had an acknowledgment but none of the faults have been fixed yet. Tom suggested that if no reply or repair within one week to contact the relevant councillor direct to have the matter chased up.
