3. Minutes of 11th April 2016

Approval of the minutes was proposed by Rab Moran and seconded by Betty Sommerville

3.1 Correction: Lynn was in attendance at the April meeting but not listed in the sederunt. The meeting was also not quorate but this had not been noted.

4. Matters arising

- **4.1 Item 8.1 Lynda Boyle-Ronaldson/Boundary:** this item could not be discussed at the last meeting as was not quorate. We are also not sure if Ruth has written to the Chief Executive. Jan happy to do so if Ruth not able.
- **4.2 Item 16.1 Plants offered to BH:** Rab offered to dig up the plants from Fiona-Frances garden but this has not been progressed as yet.

5. Treasurers Report – details already emailed to all members

- **5.1** John reported a few large transactions this last month including: deposit paid for the Hogmanay event, money for the Panto, Festival printing, Bridge Centre and money for new fridge for the Corn Ex. Jan suggested the money for the fridge come from the CC account and not Events Group account. All in agreement with this.
- **5.2 Local Priorities:** there is money left in the account Jan suggested we think of how to use this money.

6. Councillors Corner

- **6.1 Whittingham Drive:** Margaret reported potholes either side of the speed table.
- **6.2 Council Houses:** Margaret asked the councillors present why there were no council houses being built. There are plenty developments of 4/5 bed luxury houses around the town but none for locals who are in need of housing. Shamin said that they are aware of this and have had meetings to discuss the issues around housing and are trying to push this forward. The fact that so many council houses were sold has made this a major problem but we cannot change history. The new developments do have to include 25% affordable housing but this issue will not be solved overnight.

Chris Zientara commented on anti-social behaviour and that perhaps those involved should be careful where these people are housed. This was recognised but on the same hand everyone has a right to housing and we cannot pick and choose our neighbours. All antisocial behaviour issues are in hand with the ASB team.

- **6.3 Housing Development signage:** Chris McE asked who was in control of the signage throughout the town signs are everywhere and can be confusing. Tom said that diversions were in place so that heavy vehicles do not come through the town centre. He will look into it though.

- **6.4 Bin in Market Street:** the bin has been removed, but the fixing screws in the pavement left in place causing a potential trip hazard. More litter in evidence outside sandwich shop too. Can this be replaced? {Since the meeting we have had confirmation that the refurbished bin is now back insitu}
- **6.5 Artillery Park/Hardgate junction:** Ron asked if anything could be done about the parking near this junction sightlines are very bad and is an accident waiting to happen could lines be painted preventing cars parking too close to the junction. This matter has been raised at the CAPP meeting and police are going to target this area.
- **6.5 Parking at Tyneside:** Rab also brought up the problem with parking outside the Tyneside where the road narrows. This can also be a problem.
- **6.6 Victoria Terrace:** this problem remains, with cars parking on both sides of the road, close to the junction. Tom said that this was to be addressed within the Local Plan.

Thanks to the councillors and in particular to our new councillor Shamin, who along with John McMillan are planning their surgeries and will welcome any input.
